V. DEFINITIONS

<u>Clinical Practice Guideline:</u> A document created by JHHP or a nationally recognized medical organization providing criteria regarding diagnosis, management, and treatment in specific areas of healthcare based on an examination of current evidence in the medical literature to aid informed evidence-based diagnosis and treatment decisions.

VI. BACKGROUND

Clinical Practice Guidelines are systematically developed statements that provide best-practice recommendations intended to optimize patient care and assist clinicians in decision-making about appropriate healthcare for specific clinical conditions and circumstances (AHRQ). Guideline development is based on rigorous, systematic review and analysis of published medical literature and assessment of the benefits and harms of various treatment options.

According to the Health and Medicine Division (HMD) of the National Academies of Sciences, formerly, the Institute of Medicine (IOM), ideally, guidelines are developed by a multidisciplinary panel of clinicians and other experts in the field of study and should include patients to be affected by the guideline. All evidence should be summarized, including any gaps in evidence and each recommendation should be rated to inform about the quality of the evidence and strength of the recommendation. Additionally, the roll of expert opinion in recommendation development should be disclosed.

Guidelines are a tool and not intended to be fixed protocols, as individual patients may require alternate management based on comorbidities, cultural preferences, availability of resources, and biological differences, including immune response and variability in drug metabolism (UpToDate).
